HISTORIC ZOAR VILLAGE

Just north of Dover is beautiful, Historic Zoar Village, a National Historic Landmark District. Settled in the 1820's by German immigrants seeking religious freedom, the peaceful village is a gem. Enjoy the original homes and public buildings, brick sidewalks, quiet streets, and learn how Zoar residents lived successfully as a communal society for over 80 years.



FORT LAURENS

A short drive west takes you to Bolivar and makes Fort Laurens your next stop. As Ohio's only Revolutionary War Fort, you will appreciate the monument located on the museum grounds. This stop is also a trailhead for the Ohio and Erie Canalway Towpath. You will want to head south on the towpath trail, hiking in less than a mile where you will see the remains of several of the original Canalway Locks.



SUGARCREEK, OHIO

Head southwest to Sugarcreek, Ohio's Little Switzerland, to take in the World's Largest Cuckoo Clock! Listed in the Guinness Book of World's Records, the clock's band performs on the top and bottom of the hour. The Brick Wall Sculpture is located across the street from the clock. Hand carved by a local artisan, the 13 panels on this large wall illustrate life in the area.



NEWCOMERSTOWN, OHIO

You will enjoy the scenic drive through Amish country as you drive from Sugarcreek on State Route 93 to State Route 36 East to Newcomerstown to see the life-sized bronze sculpture of sport's giant, Woody Hayes! The coach will greet you outside the Olde Main Street Museum. You will enjoy this photo opportunity with The Ohio State University Coach- be certain to tag #traveltusc in your photos!

DENNISON, OHIO

Your last stop on your county driving tour will be at the National Historic Landmark, Dennison Railroad Depot Museum, just a short 15-minute drive east on State Route 36. The Depot earned its storied place in history when volunteers served 1.3 million Troops headed off to serve in WWII. The museum is housed in the original depot and in train cars; you can see additional train cars on the property.

GNADENHUTTEN, OHIO

Continue on State Route 36 East to Gnadenhutten. Early Tuscarawas County History is documented in Gnadenhutten, site of a tragic Christian Delaware massacre where 96 residents lost their lives to militiamen during the Revolutionary War. This now tranquil village has a monument and green space to explore.
